

**Materials:**

2 lb tray Stephenson Foaming Bath Butter  
1 oz fragrance oil  
Liquid soap dye  
Hand mixer with beater attachments or stand mixer (not to be reused for food prep)  
8 oz Tureen jars  
#82 Twist Top  
Spatula  
Deep mixing bowl

**Optional:**

0.6 oz Carrier oil - For example: sunflower, safflower, grapeseed, jojoba, argan  
Sugar or Salt  
Plastic Bag or Piping bag with piping tool

**Note:** In order to get the volume needed to create a fluffy whip, you will use the entire 2 lb tray for your batch. You can use more than this, but using less will be difficult to work with and will not create enough volume to allow you to benefit from the nature of the product.

- 1. Remove base from tub.** The base will be soft but should come out with a little pressure to the bottom. Place into your mixing bowl.
- 2. Break up base into large chunks.** We recommend cutting the base into large chunks to avoid clogging beaters. You can use your spatula or a knife to break it up into chunks.
- 3. Whip up the base.** Place beater all the way down into the base and beat on medium-high for about 1 minute so the base looks like whipped cream.
- 4. Add fragrance and color.** The base can hold up to 5% fragrance oil, but that may be a little too strong. We found 3% to be pleasant and strong. The base will double in size, so your dye may end up a little lighter than expected. Start with a small amount and add more after it's incorporated to achieve your desired color. If you want to add any additional carrier oils, you can add up to 2% of a liquid oil to the base. This will add additional moisturizing properties without making it feel greasy or lose volume.
- 5. Whip base until fluffy.** Beat on high for 2 - 3 minutes until the base is light and fluffy and roughly double in size. If you over whip the base it will not keep the light fluffy texture but will still be fine to use.
- 6. Add optional additives.** If you want to add sugar or salt or any other exfoliators add them now and then mix on medium just until incorporated.
- 7. Package.** Once the base reaches the consistency you prefer, it is ready to package or pipe. You can use your spatula to spoon the mixture into jars or you can use a piping bag or a plastic baggie. We found using a piping bag so much neater and cleaner. We spooned the mixture into the piping bag and just swirled it into the jars. You can also use the mixture to top cupcake soaps, bar soaps or just as an added decoration to other soap creations! It is best to use a wide mouth container so that the product can be scooped out easily. It is much too thick for a pump bottle or squeeze tube. We are using our 8 oz Tureen jar for an upscale look, but you can also use plastic PET, HDPE, Polypropylene(PP) or Polystyrene(PS) jars to package your product. This recipe will fill 8 - 10 of the 8 oz Tureen jars depending on how much you choose to whip the base.
